The topic of the article is really interesting and contemporary. Considering that sustainability is the balance between environmental, social and economic aspects, and that the multiple combinations of development policies produce different levels of equity, supportability and viability among them, in each country case study can result very interesting.

Nevertheless, reading the text the following observations arise from: The introduction is too light; the methodological approach need to be reinforced; The impression is that sustainability is reduced to a few aspects in each country: energy, transportation, waste management, and environmental conservation in the case of Sweden and balance industrialization and poverty alleviation with ecological conservation and emission reduction in the case of India; the analysis is superficial in both cases; The conclusions are too general. I recommend reviewing the approach and deepening the analysis, because the analysis and contrast of these cases can be interesting.
