The exploration of environmental interventions to improve the quality of rehabilitation settings is both important and engaging.

The subject matter of the paper is contemporary. However, to enhance its relevance and applicable nature, I recommend expanding the list of references with more recent sources.

Additionally, the introduction could benefit from a clearer statement of the paper's contribution to the existing literature.

Substantial revisions are needed, particularly concerning the descriptions of the methodology and research procedures. The current presentation of the study appears somewhat superficial. To improve comprehensiveness, it is advisable to include specific details about the study area, conducted interviews, research findings, and resulting recommendations. Providing more information about the research design, data collection, and analysis procedures would enhance the quality of the research.

One notable omission is the absence of a section specifically dedicated to discussing the obtained research results. This should be added to provide a more complete analysis of the findings.

In conclusion, the paper has potential but requires a comprehensive revision before it can be accepted for publication.
