Thanks for the opportunity to review the article. Interesting work has been done. It seems contributed to the literature. The first interesting issue is distinguishing between adaptation to slow-onset climate change rapid onset that it is necessary to have this type of view from the beginning in comparative studies. It provides the view with an interesting description of the social atmosphere surrounding India as an economy with a bright future, however, a few points need to be noted:

The title should be completely rewritten in such a way that it reflects the text of the article.

It is not appropriate to use abbreviations in the abstract. And if there is an abbreviation, it should be written in front of it. Indian Human Development Survey (IHDS) or NREGS?

The analytical method used should be stated in the abstract.

Add related keywords.

A distinction is made between the word "livelihood adaptation" and "cope whit" which should be mentioned in the text.

While the introduction is complete, it needs to categorize the content, such as suitable subtitle

New studies should be added and their results mentioned if relevant.

A figure of the migration process in the target groups can be appropriate.

Possible and potential livelihood strategies for the target group should be reported in a table

A full explanation of the concepts of social groupings in India and castes should be provided in the footnote.

The theoretical basis of choosing a relationship should be mentioned briefly.
