I read with great interest the manuscript titled "Different pattern of menstrual in patients with COVID-19 infections". The topic is interesting enough to attract the readers' attention.

A native English speaker should revise the manuscript, including the title.

- Abstract: The findings of the study should be summarized more clearly. Rewrite the results section for clarity.
- Introduction: The sentence "Virchow's triad, (hypercoagulability can be thought of in terms of Virchow's triad)" can be rearranged. Rewrite the sentence "Increased markers of complement activation such as C5b-9 in the circulation of individuals hospitalized with COVID-19 than in controls (healthy people, people in the intensive care unit with non-COVID-19 respiratory failure, or people with influenza)". Use the term "apixaban" instead of "apixiban". State your hypothesis more clearly. The last sentence of the introduction section can be written more clearly.
- Patients and Methods: Use the term "women" instead of "ladies". Please write the abbreviations in their long-form in the first place they are used.
- **Results:** In the results section, no explanation has been given for Tables 3 and 4. It would be more appropriate to specify the active ingredients of the drugs instead of the generic names. There are too many tables. Some table contents can only be given in the results section.
- Discussion: The strengths of the study have not been emphasized enough.
