Again, bold claims need to be justified. For example, "Nigeria is the largest country in Africa."

Methodology: Also, the methods are not rationalized well, particularly the use of the multistage sampling technique.

General Comments:

The paper looks original, but the arguments presented are a bit weak. It did not address any gap/contribution it seeks to make.
