

Review of: "Using Taxes to Attract the Creative Class in the Presence of a Region-Specific Rent"

I think further research by the authors in the direction of the analysis of "creative clusters" will be interesting. After all, such clusters create a single space that allows you to unite people of creative professions and entrepreneurs, exchange ideas, which strengthens their potential and contributes to the further development of the system.

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
