The text presented is well written and has an undoubted interest to be read by the general public. I myself have hooked to its reading from the beginning to the end. Congratulations regarding this to the authors. However, the research that could be done to achieve the objectives that are intended should be much more extensive than the one carried out, controlling variables of the children's sociofamily environment to control biases from this area and completing the data of the subjective interpretation of the drawings of children with some objective data of social reality. How is that "open social space" objectively to which researchers have guided children? One thing is that children have a perception of subjective fear that may not be visible to a neutral observer and another is that anyone objectively would have that perception.

My assessment is that it is a suggestive approach to a more extensive future research. Being aware of this, the magazine editor should see if it can be publicable as such an approach of interest in its editorial line.
