

## Review of: "Case Report: Pott's Puffy Tumor, But Without The Tumor"

The authors have presented a case report of a rare clinical entity with possible serious complications - Pott's Puffy Tumor. The incidence of the discussed condition in women is rare. The authors' management and surgical intervention had good recovery results without complications in a 3 month follow-up period.

The case report is worth publishing.

I would like to mention the attractive title of the article and underline some important missed details.

- 1. It is relevant to describe the previous and current use of antibiotics, since the "non-selective antibiotic treatment" was the possible cause of disease development.
- 2. It is not clear what was first, trauma or sinusitis? Is it possible to show CT-scans after trauma? Post-traumatic sinusitis with sinus fluid, which is often missed, may lead to complications. In fact, the history of clinical events helps us to understand the possibility of non-treated post-traumatic sinusitis.
- 3. It's better to choose only two or three enlarged CT-scans and mark them properly according figure legend.
- 4. Also it could be important to mention laboratory workup with blood cell count, comprehensive metabolic panel, erythrocyte sedimentation rate, and C-reactive protein.
- 5. Considering the etiopathogenesis it would be interesting to discuss the differential diagnosis and possible morphological anomalies.

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
