Review of: "Scaling up Food Processing in India by Tapping Houesholds' Potential"

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The paper tackles an important subject not only for India but also for other countries with a high rate of informal food processing industries. The paper is well-written and precise.

I do not know if it is the recommended format for commentaries, but I think more illustrations/graphs/tables would make the overall presentation of the paper more attractive while maybe reducing the text.

The statistics provided in section 1 would be more visible in such an illustration. The same goes for section 3, where a graph could provide some interesting statistics, for example, on the rate of highly processed food, ultra-sugary food, etc., in the food environments. Some statistics comparing the labor force participation of women and men across different sectors would also be nice in section 5, etc.
