## **Review Report**

- 1. I appreciate the authors for choosing a valid topic for their research.
- 2. Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) is a multi-disciplinary approach to crime prevention. Children with disabilities and autism are bullied more often than other children, although they can occasionally be bullies themselves, hence a protective environment is necessary especially in India with extreme cultural diversity and belief.
- 3. The authors have mentioned about the "Urban Jungles Project" from Australia and concluded a combination of physical, cognitive, and sensorial elements needs to be applied to create an inclusive environment which can only be achieved if all the user profiles are taken into account.
- 4. Autistic children are hyper-sensitive to temperature, pain, sound, light, texture, and people around them and insignificant stimuli might cause discomfort or pain to them.
