Review of: "Evaluation of Nyumba Ni Choo: A National Campaign to Promote Improved Sanitation in Tanzania Between 2016–2020"

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From a methodological point of view, the use of a questionnaire implemented by SMS in a sample of respondents from a commercial survey company raises an obvious problem of selection bias. And something similar occurs with the qualitative data collected in interviews with selective samples of areas where itinerant programs had recently been implemented. Although the work is very original in its conception and approach to a topic of interest, the methodology used seriously limits the validity of its results.
