The Introduction is nicely reworked; still, I recommend supplementing it with additional data (see my comment below). I commend the introduction of figures in the manuscript; they are informative and helpful to readers who are not familiar with those particular families.

I still see some copy-pasted parts from the original works, which I don't think is good. I repeat, you should recount and summarize in your own words what was published on that topic.

Introduction: If you are talking generally about the entire order of Diptera, in that case, the larvae are not only aquatic but also inhabit a wide range of terrestrial ecosystems and microhabitats. On the other hand, larvae can also be phytophagous, zoophagous, saprophagous, and mycophagous (for example, in the Syrphidae family). For these reasons, I recommend supplementing the introduction.
