

Review of: "Global Governance and Sustainable Development: Lessons from the COVID-19 Pandemic"

As mentioned in the abstract, the article explores the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on global governance, highlighting significant weaknesses in both democratic and authoritarian regimes. This is an interesting reflection on the subject, supported by a review of the literature and sources from official organizations.

However, it has some limitations, so the following changes are suggested:

- Improve the introduction of the article, adding its objective and the methodology adopted to pursue it. Also, add the main contributions of the work and a description of how the paper is structured.

The author ends the article with a reflection on the current capitalist model. However, considering the objective defined in the abstract, an identical reflection on authoritarian regimes is missing.

In conclusion, the article provides an important reflection on the impact of the Covid pandemic around the world. The main limitation of the article is precisely the lack of a clear definition of the main objectives and a description of the methodology adopted (through a literature review), as well as highlighting its main contributions.
