**Lack of Discussion on Methodology:** The article does not provide explicit details about the methodology used for the state-of-the-art review. Information on the inclusion and exclusion criteria, data extraction process, and quality assessment would enhance transparency and allow readers to evaluate the rigor of the review.

**Insufficient Practical Recommendations:** While the article discusses the importance of incorporating the SDGs into library activities and highlights the need for awareness-raising efforts, it provides limited practical recommendations for academic libraries to enhance their contributions. Concrete strategies, best practices, and case studies could have been included to guide librarians in implementing SDG initiatives effectively.

Overall, the article provides valuable insights into the contributions of academic libraries towards the SDGs. It identifies key targets and challenges, emphasizing the significance of sustainability literacy and the need for librarians to critically evaluate their efforts. However, the limited sample size and lack of methodological details slightly weaken the study's generalizability and transparency. Additionally, the article could have provided more practical recommendations for libraries seeking to enhance their support for the SDGs.
