- 1. Well-being is written differently. Some places it is written with a hyphen (well-being) and other places without a hyphen (wellbeing).
- 2. In the introduction, 5th paragraph, the in-text citation Jordan, Alfadhli & Drury, (2018) must be corrected. It should be Jordan, Alfadhli, and Drury (2018). Some other in-text citations throughout the article must be corrected. For example, Levine and Thompson, (2004), there is no comma.

On the whole, the article under consideration is of fairly good academic standard, fulfills the requirements of a research work, and I recommend it for publication in this journal.
