

## Review of: "Perceptions and Attitudes about COVID-19 Vaccines Regarding Vaccine Intention and Hesitancy of Attendants of a Healthcare Center in Northern Cyprus"

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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

The article touches on an important topic aimed at considering future measures regarding vaccination, but I would like to give you some observations:

- 1. I consider it important to present the designed questionnaire, as well as its reliability index (Cronbach's Alpha).
- 2. They do not present the methodology for selecting the sample and its representativeness
- 3. They include minors and do not mention the existence of parental consent and, in general, informed consent for the people surveyed.
- 4. There is no mention that this protocol was approved by an ethics commission
- 5. Considering that your study was carried out when the vaccines were already available and even many of the participants already had at least one dose (and many of these had already had COVID-19) I believe that the results do not impact the objective of the study which is to investigate the acceptance of the vaccine and its rejection rate.
- 6. They do not include limitations of the study

From my perspective I think it requires modifications to be published

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
