

Review of: "The Students and Faculty Perception of Digital Citizenship Practices in Distance Learning Environment – The Case Study of Al-Quds Open University"

The authors of this manuscript discuss "Digital Citizenship Practices in the Distance Learning Environment." A case study is proposed and discussed in depth. This study was conducted at Al-Quds Open University.

The subject is topical and very interesting. The construction of the manuscript is solid and the results are overall well analyzed. I recommend the following modifications before finally accepting this manuscript for publication.

- The manuscript contains some typos and I recommend that authors have it proofread by an English speaker. For
 example, please correct the title to read: "Digital Citizenship Practices in the Distance Learning Environment A Case
 Study of Al-Quds Open University".
- 2. The literature review deserves further investigation, especially with respect to blended learning, where important results have already been published to make learning more sustainable. For example, I offer the authors two major articles where digital tools are discussed. I would like the authors to contextualize and cite them: https://doi.org/10.3390/electronics11142210; https://doi.org/10.3390/su14095205.
- 3. The section "5. Definition of terms" is not useful and I recommend that the terms be explained directly in the general introduction.
- 4. In the section devoted to methodological aspects, I would like the authors to illustrate their approach with a diagram to help the reader understand the main ins and outs.
- 5. Please summarize the demographics in a summary table in addition to what is written in the body of the text.
- 6. Table B is extremely interesting, but I wish the authors would further explain the most important elements by being as quantitative as possible in the discussion.
- 7. In the discussion, the authors are invited to explain the limitations of the proposed methodology.
- 8. In the conclusion, the authors are invited to provide research perspectives.
