However, the scholarly depth could be strengthened by incorporating a more systematic literature appraisal, clearer methodological justification for source selection, and comparative analysis with established Western bioethical frameworks such as principlism and patient-centred care models. Additionally, expanding the discussion to include practical clinical case applications and interdisciplinary policy implications would improve the manuscript's translational relevance and enhance its academic impact.
