4. **Infrastructure and Maintenance:** The recommendations briefly touch on the need for improved infrastructure features like trash cans and well-maintained facilities. Expanding on this point could include suggestions for regular maintenance schedules and involving local communities in the upkeep of these facilities.
5. **Extended Operating Hours:** The point about extending the operating hours of CTCs and PTs is crucial. However, specific recommendations regarding how to implement this, such as staggered shifts for caretakers or community volunteers, could be beneficial.
6. **NGO and Community Involvement:** The recommendation about community mobilization strategies is essential, but it could provide examples of successful community mobilization initiatives or suggest ways to empower local communities to take an active role in monitoring and evaluating water and sanitation services.
