- 1. The inclusion criteria must include a statement regarding the symptom or finding of urinary incontinence.
- 'Patients who were able to follow and perform pelvic floor muscle strengthening exercises': Did you take patients with 3/5 muscle strength?
- 2. Tables VII, VIIA, VIIB are independent and redundant in the hypothesis of the study.
- 3. Why were patients evaluated and treated during radiotherapy in the method department? Could an intravaginal intervention (evaluation) pose a risk of tissue sensitivity and infection?
- 4. I believe that the section on the effect of the exercise protocol in the discussion section is superficial and should be reconsidered.
- 5. The study protocol is unique considering the fact that it is a clinical intervention and the negative effects of urinary incontinence complaints after cervical cancer treatment on women's quality of life. I believe that, after making the necessary adjustments to the study, it could be a publication that contributes to the field.
