

Pre-Hispanic Andean Philosophy.

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It refers to the history of philosophy, the development of concepts, the evolution of ideas and the process of philosophical thought in the Andean civilization before the arrival of the Spaniards in Peru, a stage of history, conventionally called "Pre-Hispanic". From the first city states, such as Caral and Chavin, to the Tahuantinsuyo or the Inca nation state.

Some of his concepts: CAMAC: the "ideal being" or true being of idealism. CAMAQUEN: the ideal being of man, the divinized spirit. CAPAC/APO: the State. CAY: matter. CHAKRA: private property. KAY PACHA: material world. KÚTIN: movement. HAMUTAC RUNA: philosopher. ILLA TICSE: the principle of illumination. MALLKI: ancestral hero. PACHA: space/time. PACHACUTI: time of transformations. PISCAPUNCHAO: the logic of the five moments. QHAPAQ MALLKU: divinity of the patriarch. RUNA: the man. SUPAY: the soul. TICSE: logos, the principle of order. TICSE CAMAC PACHA: the primordial earth. TIQSE QAYLLA: primordial substance. TICSE COCHA MAMAN: the primordial water. TICSE PACHA CAMAC: the vital force. TICSÍ RUNA: ideal model of personality. TICSE WIRACOCHA: telluric force. YANANTIN: dialectic. YAYA: citizen. YUYAY/RICCINI: to think and/or to know.
