3. Any possible explanation as to why this occurs in patients with rheumatoid arthritis? As much higher doses are given to patients with malignancy (Acute lymphoblastic Leukemia).
4. Can lymph nodes other than cervical be involved?
5. Follow-up duration not mentioned. MTX-induced LPD can develop later as well.
