

Review of: "The Imperative of a Comprehensive One Health Approach for Mosquito-Borne Disease Control in Indonesia"

The author provides a description of the conceptual One Health approach's application for mosquito-borne diseases (MBDs) in Indonesia. While the strategies enumerated for MBDs are well known and have been in practice for many years now, and with variable results in various countries endemic for MBDs, the manuscript summarizes the concept of One Health (OH) quite well. However, to make it more useful, the following is suggested:

In the Introduction, brief data about the morbidity and mortality of major MBDs would be desirable to describe the magnitude of MBDs in Indonesia.

There's no mention of 'elimination', though the manuscript describes OH for 'control' and 'eradication.'

Climate change, a major threat for MBD control, is not described, although the diagram at the end depicts it.

Undesirable repetition of a few terms/phrases may be avoided.

To strengthen the concept of OH and better explain it, the author should take at least one example from Indonesia (or outside) depicting the impact of the 'OH approach' compared to 'without the OH approach.'

Too many self-references may be avoided at the cost of other/additional referencing.

The issue of insecticide/drug resistance may also be included in the manuscript.

The manuscript may be revisited for editing, spellings, and grammar.
