This is a comprehensive case study report on the potential efficacy of glucosodiene as a possible adjuvant treatment in breast cancer.

Diagnosis and treatment are detailed and adequately described.

Two points that need to be revised:

I was "lost" in the results of the isotope bone scan. Were they due to treatment? Were they "findings"? I suggest clarifying in "before" and "after" or similar.

The vital signs are well studied, but I didn't find anything about glucose metabolism. Did you make any biochemical determinations in this regard?
