Religiocentric Expression, Intolerance, and Conflict between Majority and Minority Ethnic Groups in Bangladesh Reading the introduction to this article, in my opinion, researchers do not yet have sufficient and responsible references and integrity, especially regarding judgment on Religious behavior. Researchers should refer to the study of patterns and interactions of religious ummah contained in several articles that have a reputation. Unfortunately, researchers do not provide enough space to describe economic factors which are one of the dominant causes of potential conflicts between religious ummah in various parts of the world. This is evidenced by the final statement in the introduction mentioning that religious expression contributes to intolerance.

In addition to the general conclusion of this study, I do not think it goes into more detail about the implications of the study, although it has been stated at the end of the paper when the researcher stated that the findings of this study have implications for social policymakers, law enforcement agencies, and religious figures, but do not implicitly explain the influence and role of each of these groups.

My assessment of the subjectivity of researchers seems to play a very large role in this article, although this is not entirely true, examining religious expression should be seen from hidden factors, especially since this problem is not common in various countries, so it becomes unique to be studied by proposing influential alternative factors.
