- After the introduction, a section of "Literature Review" may be added to discuss the key findings of relevant studies for developing a better understanding of current national and international scenarios.

2. Materials and methods

 The first subheading of this section must be "Research Design," and the researcher is required to add some more detail about the study design for better clarification.

3. Results

• In tables, the researcher is required to write the full form of abbreviations (CPI, DT, SEN, PT, and EAE) for clarity.

These may be written at the end of the relevant table in abbreviated form (*) or may be written prior to drawing the table.

4. Conclusions and discussion

- To make this section more interesting and logical, discuss the findings of the data in light of other studies, and this can be made possible by adding key findings of latest relevant research studies in the literature review.
- At the end of this section, give practical recommendations based on data analysis (these may be written in the form of a separate heading as well).
