- · However, the study aim is clear.

## Introduction

The author wrote this: "On the societal level, education, especially regarding knowledge and awareness about environmental waste matters, is vital to help achieve a more sustainable lifestyle in the long run".

## Comment:

- It appears that there is no reason stated for suggesting the need for educating society on waste matters.
- · Also, in introduction, the organisation of the text between paragraphs need improvement.
- There is a constant back-and-forth inconsistent shift between problem of the study (lack of adequate knowledge), significance and need for the intervention (education or awareness). Introduction should be concise.
