Congrats for your paper. I have some suggestions to make your study stronger. These are as follows:

- 1- First, instead of repeating the same information continuously, it may be beneficial to prefer a flow of writing from general to specific.
- 2- The "Al" keyword can be deleted. Instead, the term "Fourth Industrial Revolution" can be used to replace "Industrial Revolution." Additionally, the keyword "Nigeria" can also be added.
- 3- A general check should be conducted for some spelling errors. For example, on page 2, there is a missing in "in his masterpiece An." Similarly, on the same page, the quotation mark in "Oh! Those pagans! They knew" has not been closed.
- 4- Alphabetical ordering of in-text citations will make the work more professional. For example, on page 2, "(Ford, 2015; World Economic Forum, 2016; Cedefop, 2017; Campa, 2018)."
- 5- On page 4, it is stated that this study is a comprehensive review. However, the overall flow of the research does not align with this. If changes are desired, a methodology section should be written accordingly, including inclusion/exclusion criteria and other relevant information.
- 6- It may be beneficial to provide a citation for the phrase "Even though several studies have been conducted on TU and SM, studies that specifically deal with TU" on page 5.
- 7- The first three paragraphs of the section "2. Technological Unemployment: is the world moving towards a 'workless' society?" can be enriched with more up-to-date sources.
- 8- It may be beneficial to provide a citation for the statement "These findings are consistent with the findings of a 2010 study" on page 7.
- 9- In the first six paragraphs of the section "5. Technological Unemployment, Skill Mismatch and the Future of Higher Education in Post-Pandemic Nigeria: a prognostic perspective," there is no mention of Nigeria. Therefore, it would be more useful to follow a coherent flow.
- 10- The section "Conclusion and Recommendations" could start with the overall purpose of the study and the results that emerged from this purpose.
