The article is valuable insofar as it tackles a topical problem related to linguistics. The phenomenon of social networks is a reality which pervades our lives on so many levels; language is no exception to this.

The paper includes an overview of language learning methods and a brief history of their employment in the Indian context, with a focus on CLT, considered to be the adequate environment for the inclusion of new types of communication fostered by popular culture (epitomized by social media language). This "hybridization of language" is seen as the premise of drastic change in language pragmatics.

An interesting part of the paper deals with the treatment of errors under the conditions of the impact of social media lingo on students' written productions.
