

Review of: "Developments in Regional Inequality in Greece"

The paper is well built in a systematic way. It rightly considers different measures of inequality and stresses the importance of within- and between-regions inequality. Its conclusion supports a large literature on the V-shape of the growth curve in exogenous crises (such as pandemics) with value added on the increase of the contribution of between-regions inequality to the overall inequality. A further research path is suggested concerning the structural features involved in basic economic conditions (e.g., incidence of tourism, industry/agriculture balance, relative weight of tertiary activities) of different regions. Further variables particularly involved in the COVID crisis could be investigated: mobility, for instance, and/or the spreading of online connections.
