The paper "On Violence: an Exchange with ChatGPT — ChatGPT and Suman Gupta" presents a dialogue between ChatGPT and the Author. The Author explores the extent of the concept of violence arising from ChatGPT responses, including through the use of some typical scenarios.

The idea is very interesting, although the conversation, as presented, should be seen as a starting point for a deeper analysis realized by the author. In fact, as other referees have said, it would be important that the author develops a paper following the typical structure of scientific articles. Such a structure makes clear to the reader the objectives, methodology, and arguments pursued by the author through the paper. The topic is very broad, so it allows the author several opportunities for critical analysis. For example, as other referees point out, the ChatGPT view dealt with a limited definition of violence, focusing on physical or psychological coercion. Nowadays there are many critical studies from different disciplines that stress the importance of others forms of violence.

Even the part of the advantages and limitations of the mode of argument ("involving hypothetical situations and testing formulations of violence") could be a starting point for writing the methodology section of the paper.
