Pros

- 1. Outline: The introduction is well structured, providing a logical progression of ideas from the general issue of poverty and crime to specific challenges in Pakistan.
- 2. Detail: The author provides a comprehensive contextual section on relevant studies by Khan, Bhutta, Arif, Raza, and Zaman, which establishes a strong foundation for the research.
- 3. Contextualization of the problem: The introduction highlights the profound impact of poverty on more than 70 million people in Pakistan and emphasizes the urgency of the issue.
- 4. A Multidimensional Approach: The article examines the various causes of poverty, which are then linked to crime to gain a holistic understanding of the issue.

Cons and areas to improve on

- 1. Citation and currency: Although the context of the study is important, some of the cited articles are completely dated (Fajnzylber et al., 2002; Mehlum et al., 2002; 2005). Including recent references can add relevance and credibility to the story.
- 2. Objective: The essay may benefit from the explicit statement of its research question or hypothesis, directing readers to its specific focus.
- 3. Over-emphasis on negative effects: The introduction tends to emphasize the consequences of poverty and crime, which can be balanced by adding positive possibilities or other perspectives to give a more nuanced perspective on the issue.
- 4. Transitions: Some transitions between parts are sudden and may interrupt the flow. The author might need to expound on details before moving on swiftly.
