- 1. The article provides valuable insights into children's perception of fear factors in urban open spaces. However, the introduction section could be improved by incorporating more recent research developments and enhancing clarity.
- 2. The methodology section mentions a survey conducted with 105 children. While this is a reasonable sample size, it is important to discuss how the sample was selected to ensure it is representative of the diverse population of children in the city. Additionally, information on the demographics of the surveyed children, such as age, gender, and socioeconomic background, should be included to better.
- 3. The article presents a comprehensive analysis of children's fear factors in open spaces. However, it would be beneficial to include statistical analysis to support the qualitative findings. This would strengthen the validity of the study's conclusions.

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
