The author "trimmed" their article in a very efficient way, keeping the key information salient while summarizing the definitions which were initially "cramming" the article - the end result is much more reader friendly now. The study's objectives are clearly delineated (I, II and III) and serve as a good guide for the reader to look for answers they are interested in, as per each objective. For example, objective II is well fulfilled in the section on Disability-Specific Studies which presents the between-disabilities disparities when it comes to accessibility, employment opportunities, social inclusion, and education options. Similarly, queries into Objective III are well answered in the 2 connected sections ((a) measuring DL and (b) empowerment initiatives) for no empowerment program is possible if we do not have accurate tools to measure the DL of people with disabilities, for proper program designing and planning. Here, the Digital Literacy Empowerment Programs are well presented and explained, and the gaps that need to be addressed in terms of digital literacy for PWDs are now clearly delineated. The reader can now quickly identify the gaps without having to go through the lengthy background discussions that prevailed in the first version.
