This is a well-conducted 'case report' study and the findings are useful for practitioners in this area. Minor changes required:

1. There is no need to use upper case for generic drug names when used in the text. For example change 'Linezolid' to 'linezolid' unless it is at the beginning of a sentence.
2. Do not use 'prescription language' in scientific articles. For example, change "Tab. Bedaquiline 200 mg once daily (three times a week), Tab. Levofloxacin 750 mg once daily....." etc to 'bedaquiline 200 mg once daily (three times a week), levofloxacin 750 mg once daily...:
