The scope of the study is well-defined, and the justification for the research is sound. The study reveals that low-cost housing is a major challenge for low- and middle-income earners in Uganda. The author(s) should take note of the following to improve the study:

- Some repetitions were made in some parts of the work. This statement "Detached houses are the most common housing type in Uganda, followed by huts and tenements, which take 21.5% and 18.4%, respectively." was repeated verbatim in both the introduction and literature review.
- The research objectives should be stated more clearly.
- The methodology may need to be revisited if the set objectives are to be met. The use of only a qualitative approach alone may not be ideal. Also, the findings do not adequately reflect that the objectives were met. If interviews were done (as indicated in the methodology), how were they analysed? What are the findings?
- The conclusion would also need to be reworked, and recommendations should indeed stem from the findings of the study.
- Lastly, the references should be revisited and properly listed using a consistent referencing style.
