I believe that the theme of the article is relevant and the approach with various analysis is appealing and appropriate, nevertheless I missed a bit more of context to give some robustness to the manuscript and allow a more relevant contribution.

In my opinion, the introduction fails to efficiently present the case, clearly stating the objectives and contributions of the text. I also missed a literature review, ncluding relevant CSR authors like Archie Carroll and Wayne Visser, and the inclusion of actual terms such as Social Value Creation and Corposrate Social Innovation.

The method and analysis seems ok, but I also missed some in depth ananalysis and some reference with the “real world” to present a more complete case of the status of CSR in China.

I am also ok with the conclusion although I found the research outlook slightly out of context, I would review this part and integrate in a discussion section before the conclusion.
