Congratulations on your research and the elaboration of the manuscript. It appears that the APA style has been used for citing sources in the text and references. If so, I would like to join my colleagues in offering the following additional suggestions:

- In McLeskey & Waldron, 2002; López & Hinojosa, 2012; Torres & Fernández, 2015 – a space should be left after the ampersand (&).
- (Cardona, 2000a) – It is not necessary to include the 'a'. Since the two publications have different authors, there should not be any confusion for readers.
- Present both DOIs and URLs as active hyperlinks, starting with "http:" or "https:"
- "Ainscow, M., Slee, R. & Best, M. (2019). Publisher: The Salamanca Statement: 25 years on" – the title of the work is "Editorial: The Salamanca Statement: 25 years on."
- Keep the titles of the sources in the language in which they were written and use square brackets to indicate that it is a translation done by the author of this manuscript (<https://apastyle.apa.org/blog/cite-your-own-translations#:~:text=If%20you%20translate%20a%20passage,in%20the%20in%2Dtext%20citation.>)
- Leave a space between the initials of the first names, for example, at Cardona, M.C. (M. C.)
