Vojtech Masek's article, 'Examining the Ethical and Geopolitical Context of Global Food Security Policy', seeks to stimulate the critical reflection of policy experts, academics, and civic activists in the field of food security and then relate them to broader ethical and geopolitical aspects of the food security debate.

Masek had delved into the issue of how to end the food security problem, its multistakeholder approach, and the involvement of churches and faith communities in multistakeholder food policy negotiations. He also tried to find the missing connection between the food right and civic and political liberties, as well as between the food right and democracy. He also draws positive correlations between food access and the global market economy. However, he did not talk about the drawbacks of the relation between food access and the global market economy.
