

Review of: "Examining the Comparative Effect of the Built Environment on Crime Prevention in Plotted Development, Especially for Women's Safety at Both Hot and Cold Spots"

This is a very meaningful article, and the author has focused on the role of urban architectural environments in women's health. The author conducted a very detailed investigation, and I have some comments on the article that I hope can help the author further improve the quality of the paper. Specific comments are as follows

- 1. The images in the paper need to be remade, as some of the legends are unclear and may cause confusion for readers.
- 2. The author investigated hotspots and coldspots of crime, and I found in the research results that some women have inconsistent feelings about these areas. I hope the author can fully elaborate on this issue and find the reasons behind it. I believe this can help enhance women's sense of security in future urban development.
- 3. The author conducted graphical analyses of hotspots and coldspots, but I did not see a specific analysis of various architectural environmental elements in these two areas, nor a comparison of the architectural elements in both areas to identify which crucial elements play the most significant role in women's safety.
- 4. It is recommended that the author propose improvement strategies for the architectural environment in the study area.
- 5. The author's abstract and conclusions need improvement; currently, they do not effectively reflect the article's core research findings.
- 6. The paper provides a detailed description of the investigative process but offers a rather rudimentary interpretation of the results, causing the paper to be imbalanced. It is recommended to enhance the analysis of hotspots and coldspots regions based on scientific data in the results section.

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
