## Background questions

- The article is of great interest in view of the transformations needed in our economies. Overall, it is well written in accessible language. It is easy to read.
- However, the author presents no problems. He shows the opportunities that agrotourism represents, but what is the problem, the inadequacy that justifies engaging in it. So there's no problem.
- The article has no theoretical basis. The author makes no reference to any theoretical foundation. Why not mention the concept of differential advantage in the new theory of international trade?
- The concept of differential advantage is twofold: it is necessary both to explain a part of trade, and to lay the foundations for a certain territorial development.
- The author's analysis is fairly unidirectional, omitting the question of security, which could jeopardize the potential of agritourism. It would be timely to take this into account.

The article is worth publishing, but only if its fundamental questions are taken into account.
