Congratulations on the article; photobiomodulation has been growing as a great therapy in several areas.

The article is well-written; however, I would like to suggest some observations.

In the introduction, at the end of the first paragraph,

"PB can also be combined with medications and food supplements, producing synergistic effects to these therapeutic substances, sometimes reducing the dosimetry of these substances, and reducing the adverse effects of these substances on the patient."

In this part, the use of the word is repetitive: "substances" and "reducing." I suggest that to make your reading more harmonious, you put the sentences together. For example: "...., sometimes reducing the dosimetry and the adverse effects of these substances on the patient."

In the last paragraph of the introduction, I recommend that you try to use some connective to join the isolated sentence to the previous sentence that it references: "This clinical condition can lead to death."

In the penultimate paragraph of the results and discussions, it reports on the use of photobiomodulation time in oncological patients. This paragraph was a little out of context, as the case report is about a patient with Parkinson's. There was no connection between the reason for reporting this and the illness of the patient in question.

And one more suggestion would be to bring the discussion a little more about the effect of photobiomodulation in the region where it was applied.

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
