- 1. Inconsistency, from the abstract of the study is researchers and in the introduction line 1, researcher despite the authors are two.
- 2. Most of the strong argument were not acknowledged see introduction paragraph 5
- 3. Under the theoretical framework a statement was made as "that underpins your study" the term your is not expected to be there. And oo any theory underpinning the study as claimed by the authors.
- 4. 2.2 headings sound to be like the study is a mere lecture note.
- 5. "Your also repeated in the methodology line 1"
- 6. Econometric techniques method of analysis is more of a quantitative study, and it was categorically stated in the study abstract that the study is qualitative. If at all this used the two method, then it should be mixed-mode study. There is a contradiction with the first paragraph under methodology and the research approach.
- 7. The sample of articles review is very scanty, hence, the study findings is very weak, thus, counting on the validity and reliability of the data collected.
- 8. The article writing style is also poor, there is very limited number of citations, this makes the article to be mere lecture note, not really an academic write up.
- 9. In the selections or reviewing the 10 articles, the authors have done well in getting the latest studies.

Based on the affirmations reasons or observations, I am recommending a rejection of the paper.
