Findings and discussion: The presentation of results is clear, yet aligning the findings and discussions with the research questions is recommended for coherence.

Conclusion: This section should encompass implications and recommendations derived from the study.

Other aspects: The article necessitates thorough proofreading and editing. Additionally, a careful review of citations and references is warranted
