How does India adopt healthcare-related research from other countries, and how can India help other countries to improve their healthcare? Some international collaboration is mentioned in the "Prioritizing Digital Health: Key Focus Areas" section, but please expand on this.</li> </ul>
Despite the relatively short text, there is some repetition that should be avoided.
Example:
"With the G20 India presidency, the country has an opportunity"
"India's G20 presidency for the year 2023 presents a great opportunity"
"With the presidency of the G20 group in 2023, the country has an opportunity"
"India's G20 presidency provides an opportunity"
Textual:

"relatively a new" → "a relatively new"



"NDHM (National Digital Health Mission)" and "National Digital Health Mission (NDHM)"  $\rightarrow$  introduce as "National Digital Health Mission (NDHM)", then use the abbreviation for subsequent occurrences.
