- 1. The article seems to have some interesting results that are well written.
- 2. In page 1: line -5, Page 2: Lines -6, -7, Page 20: Line 7, check the apostrophe '50%-50%'; there should be a beginning apostrophe in front.
- 3. In Page 4, Line 12 ends with a colon, which seems to be misleading towards the stated Ballot theorem. But then in the following line, a proposition is given.
- 4. In Page 5, Figure 2, it would be good if the X and Y axes were given titles.
- 5. In Page 6, Equation (6), a comma should be inserted between the probabilities.
- 6. In Page 6, line -25, a hyphen after the word "coin" seems to be meaningless and needs to be removed.
- 7. In Page 7, line -10, the definition may be included in the definition environment to enhance readability.
- 8. In Page 10, line 1, [15] is a reference, but it is given as a formula; the sentence formulation has to be checked again.
- 9. In Page 11, Line -3, a comma is missing after 0.5625. Also, what is h and d?
- 10. The abbreviation (i.i.d) can be given at its first instance, instead of being given in Page 13, line 3.
- 11. Page 13, Line 9 can be elaborated more so as to understand the ruin problem in a better way.
- 12. In the introduction, more information can be provided regarding the existing literature and the novelty of the current study.
- 13. More relevant information, if any, could be added for the sake of readers.
- 14. In page 26, line -13, recheck the formula given for probability.
- 15. In general, equations should be ended with periods or commas appropriately.

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
