- 3. For the result, replace or revised those statement that contains "we". Instead, use "the researchers". Improve the manner of presenting the data in tables. Create additional tables to separate those data that is differ or requires different approach in presenting it. Also insert legend for the tables that contains acronyms.
- 4. In the discussion part, include discussions about the relationship between respondent's socio-demographic condition and vaccination status with supporting statements that will either support or contradict the result obtained.
