The author quite correctly recognizes the need for interdisciplinary team work in addressing research. To more clearly demonstrate the importance of a Multiscalar Tradecraft (and RPAS) the paper should focus on the **specific** problems and challenges raised at the Baroro site, and the particular **questions** with which this methodology would assist. The current framing in a general Anthropocene/Interdisciplinearity context is too general and vague. In short, **identify** a research question and **show how** the proposed approach would help to both answer it and provide guidance for contemporary challenges of biodiversity loss and deforestation (if that is the intention). In that way the good ideas in this paper, which looks more like a research proposal, will become more valuable.
