I have carefully read the manuscript and found it well-written and in compliance with all the standard protocol of a scientific study like this. I did not find anything objectionable or questionable about the paper, except perhaps for some very minor details. To deepen the results of the study, there might be a need to assess the correlation and difference between the demographic profiles of the participants (gender, age, religious beliefs, etc.) and the impact on their wellbeing. I also suggest that some of the related and cited literature which I found quite dated be improved, such as those below 2010 publication, for example, the articles of Chew-Graham et al., 2003; Brown 2008, Dyrbye et al., 2006, Brauholtz S et al., 2007; Murheid 2008. I suggest that citations be listed from the latest to the earliest, for example, (Brauholtz S et al., 2007; Health Survey for England, 2011; Waqas et al., 2015). Waqas, being the latest, be mentioned first.

Overall, the paper is excellent and worthy of publication in your paper.
