1. The abstract needs to be more focused on the objectives and relevant outcomes.
2. Overall, there are language issues which need to be corrected.
3. The introduction is too long, and not focused to the matter of interest.
4. The authors should provide how many TSC cases with refractory epilepsy were screened for surgical candidacy in the study period
5. The baseline characteristics should provide more neurophysiological data- ictal onset, bilateral ictal and inter-ictal findings etc.
6. Did any patient undergo invasive EEG monitoring?
7. The authors should comment on selection criteria for achieving good surgical outcomes
